**Start: Student Union** 

The Student Union was completed in 2020, along with the College Center. Intended to be a space for students to connect and get involved, the Student Union is home to services like Student Life, Student Leadership, Student Government, Outreach, and Veteran's Services.

- College Center Completed in 2020, the College Center contains delicious dining options like Pirate's Roast, Blaze Pizza and the Captain's Table restaurant. The College Center also is home to OCC's Hospitality and Culinary Arts Programs, as well as offices of OCC's administration and the Bursar's office.
- **OCC Quad** Orange Coast College's Quad is considered the center of campus life. With expansive lawns and walkways, the Quad is the perfect backdrop for large gatherings on campus, including Club Rush, Transfer and Career fairs, Honor's Night festivities, and more. .
- **Robert B Moore Theater** The Robert B. Moore Theatre is OCC's major performing arts facility with 915 seats. The building includes the intimate Drama Lab and a new set design workshop. The venue hosts performances by the OCC Symphony, chorale, wind ensemble, jazz band, dance, and theatre areas.
- Art Center The 70,000-square-foot Art Center opened in 2002. It is the home of OCC's Visual and Performing Arts Division, including film & television, digital media, photography, ceramics, drawing, and a Pilates dance studio.e
- Library OCC's Library opened in 2008 and is the largest building on campus. With more than 100,000 titles of books, periodicals, videos, and audiocassettes, the library also features a media/computer lab, group study rooms, and individual study carrels wired for laptop computer use.
- **Planetarium** The OCC Planetarium is a one-of-a-kind science center that gives college and school-age students a chance to experience the wonders of the universe. Audiences can take in a show at the Planetarium's 125-seat domed theatre, or visit various exhibits on display in the Planetarium's atrium, including a Science on a Sphere projection and a Foucault Pendulum.
- **Lewis Center for Applied Sciences** The Lewis Center for Applied Sciences is home to the College's Math and Science Division office, as well as the Dennis Kelly Public Aguarium, the only student-run public aquarium in the United States. This 34,000 square foot building is the science hub on campus, with classroom and laboratory space for courses in marine science, geology, physics, engineering and more.

**ABC Complex** 

Orange Coast College opened the ABC (Allied Health, Biology and Consumer Science) Complex in January 2011. The 83,000-square-foot building, is the largest classroom facility on campus and includes more than \$6 million in high-tech equipment which will prepare students for variety of careers including diagnostic medical sonography, radiologic technology, and dental

- Technology Complex 10 The gleaming blue glass façade of the Technology Center is home for a variety of hands-on technical programs including construction, architecture, drafting, machine tech, electronics, woodworking, aviation pilot training, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning.
- The Harbour at OCC 11 The only community college student housing facility in Southern California, The Harbour at Orange Coast College is an 800-bed complex offering apartment-style living on campus. Students living at The Harbour are part of a vibrant community, with regularly planned activities and events, ample study space, and easy access to college facilities.
- Aquatic Pavilion and Athletics 12 OCC's recently built Kinesiology and Athletics complex is the headquarters and central hub of the College's physical education, kinesiology and athletics departments. In addition to staff offices, this state-of-the-art facility features men's and women's locker rooms, team rooms, a cardio fitness lab, athletic training facility, and a 65-metre competition-ready pool with large shade structures.
- **MBCC** Students enrolled in OCC's mathematics, business, and computer-related fields of study will likely be spending time in the Mathematics, Business and Computing Center, a state-of-the-art, three-story space that is home to three lecture halls, 10 computer labs, and plenty of study and lounge areas. Open to all OCC students, the Computing Center is equipped with the latest in technology hardware and software.
- **LLSBS** OCC's Language Arts and Social Behavioral Sciences building is the newest building on campus, and includes classrooms, labs, offices, and support spaces for the Literature and Language and Behavioral Sciences divisions. Here students also will find the Newsroom, a space for The Coast Report, OCC's student-run newspaper.
- Watson Hall Watson Hall is a one-stop shop for all student service needs. Here students will find the Enrollment Center, Admissions and Records, Financial Aid office, Transfer Center, Counseling Center, Student Equity, Guardian Scholars, EOPS, as well as Career Education and OCC's Job Placement Center.
