



Oce Connidation has Record Year

Orange Coast College's Foundation raised a record total \$5.5 million in donations during the 2004-05 academic year.

Between July 1, 2004 and June 30, 2005 the foundation raised \$5,518,481 in cash and in-kind



The Foundation's cash donations for 2004-05 totaled a record \$2,550,343, eclipsing OCC's previous best "cash" year by 23.5 percent. The college raised \$1.95 million in cash in 2001-02.

Orange Coast raised \$2,968,138 in in-kind gifts last year, up a whopping 231 percent over the previous year's total of \$1,285,319. It was more than \$500,000 short, however, of the best "in-kind" year ever, in 2002-03.

OCC's Foundation boasts total assets that are valued at more than \$17 million.

Significant major cash gifts received by the college in 2004-05 included a \$906,000 bequest from the estate of former faculty member, Shirley Brooke; \$260,000 from retired OCC librarian, George Ciarlo for scholarships and the library; \$200,039 for the School of Sailing and Seamanship Endowment from an anonymous donor; and \$50,000 from the Stuart Foundation for OCC's Guardian Scholars Program.

Significant 2004-05 in-kind gifts included the motor-yacht *Kialoa*, from yachtsman, Jim Kilroy, and a 1986 Bertram sport fisher, *Lucky L*, presented by Tom Larkin of Newport Beach.

"Our 2004-05 fund raising efforts have been extremely gratifying," said Del Heintz, chair of OCC's Foundation. "Orange Coast College is the community's institution, and the community has been extremely supportive."

Since its formal inception in the spring of 1986, the college's Foundation has received a total of more than \$43.8 million in gifts. Gifts have been split almost equally between cash (\$21.1 million) and in-kind (\$22.7 million) donations.






Designation of Cash Gifts, 2004 - 2005



to its docks


fter 31 years of ownership, Jim Kilroy gave his 80-foot aluminum sloop to the Orange Coast College School of Sailing and Seamanship in Newport Beach CA, one of the nation's largest public nautical schools with a strong offshore sail training program.

"After a wonderful three decades of racing and world cruising, it was important to me that Kialoa III continue on with her tradition of great friendships and voyages," said Kilroy, who of the

Board of Kilroy Realty, one of the nation's largest industrial real estate firms.

Hundreds of well known racing sailors have crewed aboard the famous yacht, which dramatically broke the Sydney to Hobart race record in 1975 and held it for 21 vears. Kialoa's dozens of race included victories Transatlantic, Transpac, China Sea, Swiftsure, and the World Ocean Racing Championships.

But more than the victories, Kilroy enjoyed the "Kialoa family," an evolving group of skilled amateur sailors who would comprise Kialoa's 16 to

22 person crew during her aggressive racing career. Many went on to sailing fame and skippering their own boats. "Sailing on *Kialoa* has always been about giving 100% when racing and then having a great time together ashore. We've had a lot of wins, great friendships, and tremendous experiences." Kilroy said.

Designed by Sparkman & Stephens and built by the Palmer Johnson shipyard in 1974, Kialoa was the third of Kilroy's five big racing yachts. Each yacht built upon the successes and knowledge of her owner, in a career that ultimately spanned a half century of ocean racing. However, Kialoa III remained Kilroy's favorite. When her racing career ended in the early



1980's, Kilroy converted her into a comfortable cruising yacht and explored the world. In the last decade, *Kialoa III* has cruised the Mediterranean, Caribbean, South Pacific, New Zealand, and South America.

Kialoa III was delivered by her crew to Panama, where ownership transferred to Orange Coast College. A crew from the College's sailing school met the boat in Panama and sailed her to Newport Beach, arriving in mid June. According to OCC sailing program director Brad Avery,

Kialoa is a welcome addition to the School's fleet of three dozen boats. "Kialoa III is an extraordinary gift for our program, Avery said. "She's a tremendous boat, well-built, strong, fast, with an incredible history. We're very excited."

Kialoa joins another famous yacht at the College, the 65-foot Alaska Eagle. The College has owned the former global racer for 23 years and has sailed the vessel more than 300,000 miles throughout the world on student training voyages.



BOAT DONATIONS

The OCC School of Sailing and Seamanship continued to receive significant gifts of yachts and boating related equipment in 2004. Major gifts included the 67' motoryacht *Cheyenne*, the 46' sportfisher *Lucky L II*, (shown here) and the 52' racing sailboat *Victoria*. Dozens of smaller craft were also donated. The value of these gifts exceeds \$2 million.

Orange Coast College Receives \$900,000 Gift from Estate of Former Faculty Member



Orange Coast College Foundation received a \$900,702 gift from the estate of former faculty member, Shirley Jane Brooke.

Brooke, a longtime Costa Mesa resident, died at her home in March of 2003. She was a member of OCC's physical education faculty from 1956 through 1964. She taught a variety of physical education courses. coached OCC's women's basketball, field hockey and softball squads.

Born in West Haven. Conn., Brooke received her bachelor's degree in physical education from New York University, and earned an M.A. in physical education from Florida State University. Prior to joining OCC's faculty, she taught at Los Angeles City College. She also taught high school in Illinois, and served as an officer in the United States Navy, from 1948-52.

Brooke left the college in 1964 to open a bookstore in Costa Mesa, which she maintained for many years.

"This is the largest cash bequest the college has ever OCC received," Foundation director, Doug Bennett. "It ranks as our fourth largest gift ever."

In addition to leaving the major portion of her estate to Orange Coast Brooke, who had no living relatives, provided bequests for \$100,000 each to California State University Beach and Long Pepperdine University.

The Foundation has allocated \$18,000 to establish a lending library of textbooks this Spring, and to provide scholarships for students who can't afford to purchase classroom books.

Using these funds and combining them with other donations that have been contributed the Foundation, OCC's Library has purchased 200 of the top textbooks that are being used in Orange Coast College classrooms this spring.

"Students are able to come into the library and check out a chemistry, history or political science textbook or a host of other subjects for use in the library for a two- or fourhour period," says OCC Foundation director, Doug Bennett.



"Additionally, funds have been set aside to purchase books for students whose circumstances such as child care issues or work-related difficulties prevent them from being able to utilize the books on reserve in the library. Following the spring semester, we will assess the program and adjust as needed to best meet the needs of our students."

"The Orange Coast College Foundation understands that one of the biggest obstacles students face in being successful today is the rising cost of textbooks," says Foundation chairman, Del Heintz. Heintz is vice president of Comcast Cable in Costa Mesa.

"We hope that by establishing this book scholarship program, and developing a lending library of textbooks, we can begin to alleviate some of the challenges that OCC students face."


OCC's Wheeler Station Vancouver, the heavily wooded provides a summer base for OCC students pursuing studies in marine science, photography, geology, and environmental studies.

Henry hen Wheeler donated Rabbit Island to Orange Coast College in 2002 he did so "to inspire college students to learn more about the distinctive marine setting of the Pacific Northwest". OCC made significant steps towards this goal in 2004 - 2005.

Located 50 miles north of isle lies between Vancouver Island and the Canadian mainland in the Gulf Islands archipelago. At the time of donation Rabbit Island, consisted of four large water-view cabins, a cozy lodge and a few other outbuildings. The island is supplied with its own power through a diesel generator and solar and wind generation. A desalinization system provides fresh water.

In 2004 and early 2005, staff from OCC's School of Sailing and Seamanship made several trips to the Island to complete major facility repairs and improvements in cooperation with Hugh Jervis, the island's caretaker. Major improvements included the construction of a 200-foot dock and float, which allows large boat access to the Island at any tide. All four cabins received interior improvements, including new flooring, furniture, and wash rooms. A new separate restroom facility was constructed next to the lodge.

The summer of 2004 saw the



first of OCC's credit courses to be offered at its Pacific Northwest campus. OCC marine science professor, Dennis Kelly offered Marine Intertidal Ecology and Visual instructor. Blade Gillissen offered his Special Projects Photography course. Both were well attended with the Photography class being registered to capacity. Gillissen's class was partially sponsored through donations from Fuji Film, Polaroid and local vendors. A rep from Fuji accompanied the students on their week-long stay, provided film for their projects, and access to state of the art equipment for their portfolio development. After their


return from the Island and completion of the course, a month long photography exhibit titled "Rabbit Island: The Show" was displayed in the OCC Art Center.

Because of their success both of these courses were offered in Summer of 2005, along with William Breece's course in "Field Archaeology" and a biodiversity study initiated by

Marc Perkins. college also offered a non-credit photography course taught by accomplished professional photographer Don

Gale and kayaking courses.



The money also aids the college's Performing and Visual Arts Division.



Hoag Foundation Grant Insures that OCC will Become First Two-Year College

with Baby Simulator

he Orange Coast College Foundation has received a \$42,000 grant from the George Hoag Family Foundation of Santa Monica to purchase a baby simulator for use by students enrolled in its School of Allied Health Professions.

The simulator arrived on campus this summer for Fall classes beginning Monday, Aug. 29

OCC becomes the initial community college in the nation to have a BabySIM on its campus. Four years ago, OCC was the first of California's 109 community colleges to have the adult patient simulator on campus, purchased for \$200,000.

The only other BabySIM in the state of California is currently being used by medical students at the University of California, Davis.

BabySIM and the adult human patient simulator are manufactured by Medical Education Technologies, Inc. (METI) of Sarasota, Fla. BabySIM

will be used by students training in OCC's Respiratory Care, Cardiovascular Technology, Diagnostic Sonography, Neurodiagnostic Technology, Radiology, and Emergency Medical Technology departments.

BabySIM includes such complex characteristics as realistic touch and feel, clinched fists and a loving layer of baby fat. Those features will provide OCC students with an extraordinarily realistic experience with a three-to-sixmonth-old "baby."

"Such critical care interventions as infant CPR, airway interventions, drug administration and defibrillation can be applied to the BabySIM,"

says Kevin T. Ballinger, dean of OCC's Consumer and Health Sciences Division.

"This new simulator will prepare Orange Coast College allied health students to face critical events involving babies that are routinely encountered in real-world health care situations. Babies are our most vulnerable patients, and OCC wants its students to be fully competent in dealing with any crisis that might arise."

OCC's full-size adult simulator has been providing students with valuable on campus training for four years. The BabySIM will be located in a laboratory that was specifically remodeled several years ago to accommodate the adult simulator.



Orange Coast College Foundation Hosts Car Show, Raising Over \$3000


