Cognitive Neuroscience of Aging Research Study, Center for the Neurobiology of Learning and Memory, UCI

Volunteers are needed for studies that investigate brain activity and memory. In this project, you will have your brain activity monitored either through the recording of electrical activity (EEG) or through an imaging method called functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) while performing simple tasks. Studies involve either one or two visits to the laboratory, each taking between one and three hours. You will be reimbursed for travel expenses and receive compensation for your participation. In order to take part, you must be:

- between 63 -77 years of age
- a fluent English speaker
- right-handed
- in good general health
