OCC Awarded \$50,000 NASA MUREP Prize to Host NASA Robotics Competition

range Coast College has been awarded a \$50,000 prize from NASA's Minority University Research and Education Project (MUREP) to host NCAS Robotics: Engineering the Future. OCC is one of nine community colleges nationwide to receive the MUREP Partnership Learning Annual Notification (NASA MPLAN) award.

The prize money will be used to host a week-long, oncampus NASA Community College Aerospace Scholars (NCAS) Robotics Competition in partnership with Southwestern College (SWC) in Chula Vista. OCC has hosted this competition for several years with SWC. NCAS not only supports academic growth, but the program also prepares students for careers in aerospace. OCC students have a track record of being selected for NASA internships after completing the program and may even land themselves a NASA job after graduation.

"We're thrilled to continue our longstanding collaboration with Southwestern College on the NCAS Robotics Competition," says OCC Planetarium Director Jessica Artinger. "Having successfully hosted the program for several years, this new funding through NASA's MUREP allows us to make NCAS more robust than ever. We're especially excited to connect our MESA programs for the first

time, strengthening the pipeline of future innovators and creating even greater opportunities for students to explore STEM in hands-on ways."

MUREP is committed to engaging underrepresented and underserved students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) with authentic learning experiences to sustain a diverse workforce.

The organizers for the NCAS Robotics: Engineering the Future are OCC Planetarium Director Jessica Artinger, OCC MESA Director Theresa De Los Santos, SWC MESA Director Dr. Mourad Mjahed, and SWC Math Faculty Dr. Minerva Garcia.

NCAS Robotics: Engineering the Future will take place in June 2026.

range Coast College, a designated Hispanic-Serving Institution, will celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month by bringing together the campus community to celebrate and learn about Hispanic and Latinx culture and provide a space to amplify Latinx voices through a series of planned events.

National Hispanic Heritage Month runs from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15 and celebrates the cultures and contributions of Hispanic and Latinx people. The celebration at OCC commenced with a Counseling for Latinos for Equity and Engagement (CLEEO) Project 19.0 event on Sept. 23. The event, titled "Latinidades and Philosophy: The Next 25 Years," will be led by Dr. Manuel Vargas, Professor of Philosophy at UC San Diego. He discussed Latina/o/x/e philosophy and the upcoming challenges and opportunities over the next quarter-century.

There are three additional CLEEO Project 19.0 events including, "Preventing AI from Hijacking Education," presented by Dr. Stephen J. Aguilar, Associate Professor of Education at USC Rossier School of Education; "The Photography of Luis C. Garza: Visual Literacy & the Chicano Lens," presented by Luis C. Garza; and a film screening of "Walls of Passion."

Additionally, the Student Equity Office hosted Lunchteria, on Sept. 30, which included delicious Hispanic-inspired food and a few exciting rounds of lotería.

Hispanic Heritage Month celebration activities will continue with Hispanic Heritage Day on Monday, Oct. 13, from noon to 2 p.m. in the Main Quad. This event, organized by Puente, UndocuScholars, and The Harbour, will celebrate Hispanic heritage through music, tasty treats and cultural activities.
