**MORE ABOUT DUAL & CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AT OCC:**

- OCC uses "Dual Enrollment" to include all opportunities for high schoolers to enroll in college courses with us. The opportunities in this book are "Concurrent Enrollment" or what our website calls "Standard Dual Enrollment." This means that you will earn college credit, but not high school credit. If you're interested in receiving both high school and college credit, you should check with your high school to see if there are specific courses that might be best for you take.
- Be on the lookout for traditional Dual Enrollment or "CCAP Dual Enrollment" opportunities; these are OCC courses that are offered for free on your high school campus for which you can often receive both college and high school credit.

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## COURSE LOCATION DESCRIPTIONS

**OCC ON CAMPUS:** This class is on campus and students are required to attend in-person.

**OCC ONLINE:** This class is fully online and does not include in-person zoom scheduled time nor on campus visits. Students must email the instructor by Wednesday of the first week of class.

**OCC LIVEONLINE:** This class is offered using Zoom, Canvas Conference, or other synchronous technology during the scheduled time. Students should use a computer/laptop. Mobile phones may not be sufficient.

### STEP 2: COMPLETE THE OCC CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT FORM

After you receive your OCC Acceptance Email, which includes your OCC Student ID Number, complete the [Standard Dual Enrollment Form](#). It is a good idea to include all the classes you are considering taking this semester on the form, because sometimes your first choice may be unavailable at your registration date. Be sure it has the appropriate signatures (parent/guardian and your HS Principal). Email it to <mailto:dualenrollment@occ.cccd.edu>. You will be notified via email when the form is processed.

### STEP 3: REGISTER FOR THE APPROVED COURSE(S) ON YOUR FORM

You may register for your approved courses anytime on or after your registration window opens. View when your window opens on your [MyCoast Account](#). Log into MyCoast → select the “Registration” tab → find “Registration Status & Checklist.” All registration is done online in your MyCoast portal. After you register, pay your course fees to secure your seat in the class; you may be dropped from the class for not paying your fees on time.
