# Placement Matrices for Math, English, and ESL Based on the MMAP Phase II Rule Set

This document summarizes the placement recommendations detailed in the <u>Phase 2 decision rules</u> publication. As described in that document, there are two sets of rules for each subject area: One set of rules is based on "direct matriculants" (DM), which are students who begin matriculation processes before their complete high school transcript is available, and for this reason their placement criteria were developed using data up through 11<sup>th</sup> grade (12<sup>th</sup> grade data not available). The other set of rules is based on "non-direct matriculants" (NDM), for whom a complete high school transcript is available (including 12<sup>th</sup> grade data). Following this pattern, this document contains two matrices for each subject area.

However, based on feedback from pilot colleges, the choice of the DM and NDM nomenclature does not convey the fact that the MMAP placement of a student is based solely on data availability and not on when a student applied. For instance, if a student waited a year to enroll in college but only 11<sup>th</sup> grade data is available in Cal-PASS Plus, that student would be considered a DM due to data availability. Similarly, a student who directly applies to college after high school but has 12<sup>th</sup> grade data (e.g. self-reported or manual placement via transcripts) would be considered a NDM.

To limit this confusion, we refer to the tables as follows:







Assessment Testing and Placement Recommendation

## Assessment

# Can colleges continue to offer existing curricular sequences and placement practices and study them for the next two years?

No. AB 705 requires that all of the California community colleges adhere to the principles of the law. By the fall of 2019, colleges must re-engineer their local assessment practices to utilize high school performance as the primary vehicle for placement recommendations and discontinue the use of standardized placement tests. The Board of Governors must approve placement instruments, and they have not approved any for English or for math; however, they may for ESL. Colleges must also follow the two central conditions of the legislation:

1. Students cannot be placed into pre-transfer courses unless the college can demonstrate that they are highly unlikely to succeed in them

2.Enrollment in a pre-transfer course must improve the students' likelihood of success in the transfer course

When comparing the likelihood of success, colleges are encouraged to look at the differences between pretransfer requirements and throughput and direct placement into the transfer course. Unless colleges adopt the default placement rules, they will need to validate local practices and demonstrate that they meet the standards of the law described above.

## Assessment

#### 78213.

- (a) No community college district or college may use any assessment instrument for the purposes of this article without the authorization of the board of governors. The board of governors may adopt a list of authorized assessment instruments pursuant to the policies and procedures developed pursuant to this section and the intent of this article. The board of governors may waive this requirement as to any assessment instrument pending evaluation.
- (e) For purposes of this section, "assessment" means the process of gathering information about a student regarding the student's study skills, English language proficiency, computational skills, aptitudes, goals, learning skills, career aspirations, academic performance, and need for special services. Assessment methods may include, but not necessarily be limited to, interviews, standardized tests, attitude surveys, vocational or career aptitude and interest inventories, high school or postsecondary transcripts, specialized certificates or licenses, educational histories, and other measures of performance.

# Can placement tests be used as a tool to help students evaluate the best placement for themselves?

No, for English and mathematics/quantitative reasoning at this time all placement tests must be approved by the Board of Governors, which also includes "surveys" or "questionnaires" if they are being used as placement instruments. **August 2018 FAQs** 

# Who does this apply to?

#### Does AB 705 only apply to transfer students?

No, AB 705 is applicable to all students who are seeking to complete a degree. While all students need a transfer level English composition course for degree completion, math requirements vary. Placement in math should align with the student's educational goal. If a student declares a major or goal that requires transfer level math or quantitative reasoning, then the student should be placed in the correct math and at the correct level. If a student declares a major or goal that includes a local degree or certificate, then the student should be placed in the math or quantitative reasoning that matches the student's goal. **August 2018 FAQS** 

The regulations should ensure that, for students who seek a goal other than transfer, and who are in certificate or degree programs with specific requirements that are not met with transfer-level coursework, a community college district or college maximizes the probability that a student will enter and complete the required college-level coursework in English and mathematics within a one-year timeframe. **Text of bill**

## Actions needed

- Endorsement to drop placement testing for Math & English
- Endorsement to "Not" enforce prerequisites in target classes (i.e. English 100 & the target Math courses)
