NAME OF CLUB	DESCRIPTION & DETAILS
Dungeons & Dragons Club	Our mission is to connect students who have an interest in Dungeons & Dragons or other tabletop role playing games. We also occasionally offer workshops to help introduce curious newcomers to the hobby.
EmpowHER at OCC	We are a club dedicated to empowering women of all backgrounds by celebrating their diverse strengths, skills, and experiences. Through volunteer work, community involvement, and campus initiatives, we strive to raise awareness about gender inequality, advocate for positive change, and create a supportive community where women can connect, grow, and make an impact.
Marine Mammal Research Group	The Marine Mammal Research Group's purpose is to educate students with an interest in marine mammals and contribute data to larger research projects, while also conducting our own.
Wild Lens Collective	Wild Lens Collective (WLC) is a student organization that brings together science and media to explore wildlife, technology, and environmental storytelling through collaborative projects and creative content.
Soft Toy Sewing Society	Our mission is to create stuffed animals each week, and donate them at the end of the semester to an organization that helps children and families in need. We also aim to create a supportive environment for members of all skill levels by offering sewing instruction to those who want to learn, and providing them with the opportunity to apply those skills in meaningful ways with projects suited for beginners.
Entrepreneurship Club at OCC	The OCC Entrepreneurship Club is a student-run community for people serious about building things, not just talking about them. We bring in guest speakers who've actually started companies, run workshops on real skills (sales, advertising, social media growth, etc), and connect members with each other for collaboration, networking, and accountability. This isn't a resume club. If you're looking to start a business, already running one, or just want to be around people who are, this is for you.

Astronomy Club	OCC Astronomy Club is open to all students regardless of major, from those with only a passing interest in astronomy to the lifelong enthusiasts.
