Recycling Center – Coast Report may do a ride along during the Friday pick-ups. There are plans in the works to have a recycling drive working with the large lecture classes possibly for extra credit. Three to one recycling bin ratio presently, trying to get a recycling bin for every trashcan but for now they're looking into reminder stickers on trashcans as an alternative.

Digital Signage – Rosanne Kings and students came up with a number of alternate ideas to the digital signs, including movable podiums rather than signage on buildings, options are being researched. Information to review for proposals is in the dropbox.

Revenue Generating – Continuing to research arcade games, seeing what's popular and what the options are for contracts, renting, etc. Asian and Mexican were the most popular types of food trucks in the polls so far, thinking of doing food trucks days rather than regularly scheduled, they are working with Thomas Selzer in the Cafeteria. Vending machines are still being researched and weighing the options as far as renting and repairs.
