Advocacy Committee Changes

Change 1. Remove to Part III (General By-Laws Code), Article II (Branch Bylaws), Section A (Advocacy Committee), 5. Powers, Duties, & Responsibilities

- Shall meet at least once a week during the Spring and Fall semesters to address issues related to students and colleges.
- Shall examine local, state and federal legislation; ballot initiatives; and policies. b.
- Shall examine campus and Coast Community College District policies. c.
- Shall organize and execute legislative visits at least once a year. d.
- Shall address issues related to state and regional shared governance. e.
- f. Shall conduct a polling event once a semester to get a better understanding of the concerns of Orange Coast College students.
- Shall communicate its findings to the Student Senate and Executive Board through the Vice President of Advocacy Committee. g.

Change 2. Add to Part III (General By-Laws Code), Article II (Branch Bylaws), Section A (Advocacy Committee), 8. Sub-Committees

- Legislative Affairs Sub-Committee
 - i. Shall research, track, and summarize legislation throughout the year; shall help to organize legislative visits; and work on items designated to them by the Legislative Affairs Officer, the Vice President of Advocacy, or the Advocacy
 - ii. Shall be chaired by the Legislative Affairs Officer.
- Civic Engagement Sub-Committee
 - i. Shall impact the lives of Orange Coast College students and develop the combination of knowledge, skills, values, and motivation for them to become involved in the community through both political and non-political processes.
 - ii. Shall host the following events:
 - 1. A voter registration drive at least once a year.
 - 2. A polling event at least once a semester to get a better understanding of the concerns of Orange Coast College students.

Sustainability Committee Changes

Change 1. Add to Part III (General By-Laws Code), Article II (Branch Bylaws), Section H (Sustainability Committee), 2. Composition and Membership

- The Sustainability Committee shall be comprised of no more than seven (7) eleven (11) officers, including the Chair of Sustainability Committee.
- By virtue of the office of the Vice President of Fiscal Affairs, the Vice President of Fiscal Affairs, or their designee, shall hold membership on the Sustainability Committee. The following members shall be appointed to the Sustainability Committee:
 - i. Two (2) Student Senators where one (1) of the two (2) Senators will serve as the Chair of Sustainability Committee
 ii. The Vice President of Fiscal Affairs, or their designee
 iii. Two (2) Fiscal Affairs Council officers

 - iv. One (1) Executive Board officer
 - v. One (1) Advocacy Committee officer
 - vi. One (1) College Life Committee officer
 - vii. One (1) Inter-Club Council officer
 - viii. One (1) Orange & Blue Spirit Crew member
 - ix. One (1) Volunteer Team member
- The Student Senate and Executive shall appoint from its body, two (2) Student Senators to the Sustainability Committee, one (1) being the chair. Each of the members, except for the Vice President of Fiscal Affairs, shall be appointed during their respective branch meeting.
- The Fiscal Affairs Council shall appoint from its body, two (2) officers to the Sustainability Committee.
- e. In the event that Student Senators and Fiscal Affairs officers are unable to serve on the Sustainability Committee, then the positions will be opened up to all other branches. The Student Senate and Executive Board shall ratify these appointments.

Student Senate Changes

Change 1. Add to Part III (General By-Laws Code), Article II (Branch Bylaws), Section I (Student Senate), 6. Position Descriptions C. Student Senators

- i. Each Student Senator must sit on at least one (1) Participatory Governance Committee.
- ii. Student Senators shall make a weekly verbal report in Student Senate meetings.
- iii. Student Senators shall have one (1) office hour weekly, during the regular school sessions (fall and spring semesters), in which they are only to conduct Student Senate business. Attendance of meetings is mandatory and Student Senators will adhere to this standard. Violation of attendance will be addressed by the Student Senate President and the Advisor.
 - 1. When officer is nearing or is in violation of SGOCC Policy 1004: SGOCC Attendance/Truancy, the Student Senate President and Advisor will be in charge of addressing the matter with the officer. The Student Senate President and Advisor will discuss and decide if need be in removing an officer.
- iv. Each Student Senator shall have equal voting privileges, except that the chair of the Student Senate meetings may vote only in the event of a tie.
- Student Senators may, for cause, relieve a Student Senator from the position of Student Senate President or Vice President with two-thirds approval of those present and voting of the Student Senate.

- vi. Student Senators shall submit, to the Vice President of Diplomatic Affairs, a written or typed report of the Participatory Governance Committee meetings that they attend within a 72 hour period.
- vii. Student Senators must serve on at least one (1) of the Student Senate and Executive Board's standing committees, adhoc committees, or taskforces.

Change 2. Add to Part III (General By-Laws Code), Article II (Branch Bylaws), Section I (Student Senate), 7. Vacancies and Order of Succession

- a. Where a Student Senate seat has been declared vacant, the vacant seat shall be filled through noticed Student Senate action.
- b. If vacancies should occur in the Student Senate:
 - i. If the vacancy occurs prior to the end start of the second week in the fall semester, the runner up of the recent ASOCC elections shall be offered the position until the seat is filled.
 - 1. If all runner-up candidates should refuse the position, a special election will be held.
 - ii. If all runner up candidates should refuse the position, if there are no runner ups, or if after the second week in the fall semester. If the vacancy occurs after the start of the fall semester, an application and interview process shall be conducted. Interviews will be held in open meeting pursuant to Ralph M. Brown Act and the remaining Student Senators will make an appointment based on a majority vote of those Student Senators present and voting, from the pool of interviewed candidates.
