### OCC's Hot Food Team Places Second at National Competition

Orange Coast College's Hot Food Team received a silver medal at the American Culinary Federation's National Convention in Florida last weekend.

The team competed against four other schools from different regions around the United States, as well as a team representing the military.

OCC's Hot Food Team is selected by culinary instructors who handpick student chefs who they believe show promise and who do well under pressure. Team members often spend up to 20 hours a week in the kitchen practicing, in addition to their regular coursework in pursuit of an advanced certificate in culinary arts and, for many, part-time work as chefs at local restaurants and hotels. cementing its status as one of the best culinary programs in the nation.

Over the years, OCC's program has garnered a reputation for providing a first-class education at a fraction of the cost of private culinary schools. With many graduates going on to careers as head chefs or owners of successful catering businesses and restaurants, OCC's culinary arts program also has an extensive network of alumnus who represent the quality of education students receive at the College.
