Minimum Requirements for Upper Division Transfer Admissions Eligibility:

Complete 60 CSU-transferable units by the end of the prior Spring semester for Fall transfer OR by the
end of the prior Summer semester for Spring transfer; check each campus to confirm deadlines. Any
Coast District course numbered 100 or above is CSU transferable (and/or check www.assist.org).
Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 in all CSU transferable coursework. *Some majors/campuses
may require a higher GPA for major admissions selection.
Complete minimum major preparation: review www.assist.org and each campus-specific website to
identify specific major preparation courses required or recommended by each campus.
Complete minimum 30 units of General Education courses, OR complete full CSU GE Breadth (Option 2)
IGETC (Option 3) OR Cal-GETC pattern, General education courses must include the Golden Four:

Review AD-T, Impaction, and local area preference information.					
0	Associates Degree for Transfer (AD-T): Check to see if an AD-T is a suitable option for you.				
0	Campus Impaction: Impacted campuses have more applicants than they can accommodate and				
	may utilize supplemental criteria in the admissions process, such as specific minimum major				
	preparation or increased minimum GPA.				
0	Local Service Area Preference: Most impacted campuses have a local service area from which				

applicants are given preference. Students from outside the service area will need to meet higher GPA and/or major preparation standards.

	Apply through <u>CalStateApply</u> between October 1 st – November 30 th for Fall transfer OR August 1 – 31 st for Spring transfer. Attend <u>CSU Application workshops/open labs</u> and <u>drop-in hours</u> for <u>application</u>

	Application Follow-up: Submit a Transfer Academic Update through CalStateApply in January for Fall
	transfer OR in September for Spring transfer. Some majors may request additional documentation or
	other updates. Campuses may ask you to create an account within their campus portal to receive any
	communication and application updates. Follow instructions and deadlines provided from each campus.
	If earning a degree from OCC, file a Petition for Graduation through the Graduation Office. If you are
	completing an AD-T, file a petition by February 15 th for Fall transfer or August 1 st for Spring transfer.
	If accepted, submit your Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) to one CSU campus by their SIR deadline.
	Order your official transcripts and general education certification (i.e. CSU GE, IGETC or Cal-GETC) be
	sent to your CSU campus by designated deadlines. Order Transcripts under "My Records" tab on MyCoast
	portal.
