

California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) 2025-2026, is the singular lower division general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students transferring to the California State University (CSU) or the University of California (UC). Completion of Cal-GETC will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College to a California State University or a University of California campus or program generally without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. While it is strongly recommended to complete Cal-GETC prior to transfer, completion of Cal-GETC may not be appropriate for some engineering, math, science, or other high unit majors. Visit each campus for more information. Please see the OCC TC website & counselor for additional information.

- The course must have a minimum unit value of 3 semester/4 quarter units to meet the requirements for Cal-GETC.
- A minimum "C" grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC. A "C" is defined as a minimum of 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale.
- Courses completed at a California Community College will be applied to the subject area in which they were listed by the institution where the work was completed – see ASSIST.org. A course must be taken during a term approved for Cal-GETC (https://www.assist.org/)
- A course may be approved in multiple Cal-GETC Areas but can **only** be used to satisfy a single Area 1-6 requirement.
- Foreign coursework from non-institutionally accredited institutions (formerly US regionally accredited institutions) may not be used

Upon transfer to UC, a course that is approved to fulfill a Cal-GETC subject area may be used to satisfy the LOTE requirement if it meets relevant UC criteria. LOTE is a graduation requirement for UC students. Each UC and each major at the UC vary in what will fulfill this graduation requirement. It is not part of Cal-GETC and is not an admission requirement. Please note: Students who complete any part of their education between 9th and 12th grade at an institution where the language of instruction is other than English will not receive UC unit credit for courses taken at Orange Coast College in the same language.

## What is Cal-GETC Certification?

- "Certification" means that the last California Community College a student attended for a regular term (Fall or Spring for semester schools or Fall, Winter, Spring for quarter schools) prior to transfer to the UC or CSU system will verify that the student has completed the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) Requirements.
- Cal-GETC completion is required for students earning an Associate's Degree for Transfer (ADT).
- As of this printing, partial Cal-GETC certification is not granted students pursuing an ADT or transferring to a CSU.
- Partial Cal-GETC certification **is granted** to UC bound students where Cal-GETC is accepted. Students may complete a maximum of two courses of the Cal-GETC pattern after transfer. Neither course to be completed may be English Communication (Area 1) or Mathematical Concepts (Area 2).

## How do I request a Cal-GETC GE certification?

The Cal-GETC GE certification must be initiated by the student (it's not automatic.)

- To request a certification, submit a <u>official transcript request</u> to the Student Records Office and indicate that you need certification with the transcript.
- Mark the GE Cal-GETC certification box on the transcript request form.
- Cal-GETC certification can only be mailed directly to the transfer school.
- Certifications should be requested on the last (final) transcript going to your transfer school.
- If you've completed coursework at other institutions, official transcripts from those schools must be on file at Orange Coast College prior to your request.
- If you have not completed the Cal-GETC transfer patterns, you are not ready to send your transcript with this certification.
