While each case is individual, students may need **2 to 5 visits over a span of 2 weeks** to complete all physical exam items.

Allied Health Physical Process:

Obtain your immunization records from your High School, your primary Dr/Pediatrician/clinic, parents or military records & bring to the SHC. **Do not get any immunizations before seeing the nurse.**

Call 714-714-7705 to schedule an appointment.

At your initial appointment with a nurse (60 minutes): They will review your paperwork, immunizations and determine which blood tests you need, collect urine for analysis (not the same as a drug screening), administer a TB skin test (only on Mondays/Tuesdays) and send for bloodwork, which will be done at an outside lab.

Subsequent visits are necessary for the TB skin testing process (1st step return in 48-72 hrs; if negative, place 2nd step in 1-3 weeks, and read 48-72 hrs). A Positive TB result requires a Chest X-Ray (outside provider).

Lastly, a visit for a final review of paperwork and a physical exam with the provider will be done.

Any remaining vaccines will be referred to an outside clinic, and you are responsible for providing proof to your program.
